
We are excited to share our Values Statement was developed by staff with feedback from our school community.


At Crichton Park, we spark curiosity, build resilience, foster respectful relationships, and create lasting memories in a safe, caring space where every child belongs.






- Student Safety: Students may be out front during recess and lunch, so avoid driving and parking in front of the building.

What is the SAC?

SACs are volunteer organizations that receive their authority from the Education Act (2018). SACs provide parents/guardians, school staff, community members, and, when appropriate, students, with a voice to influence decisions that impact student learning. SACs advise their principal and Regional Centres for Education on policies, curriculum and programs, school practices, student support services and parent-school communication. The SAC does not have a role in: advising on personnel matters, such as supervision or discipline of staff or the principal, carrying out the responsibilities of staff, each of whom have professional and legal obligations and carrying out the day-to-day operations of the school.

Members

SAC members include: parents of current students, community members, school principals, teacher and school support staff. For junior high and high schools, if students are in at least grade 7, they may also be able to be a member of their school's SAC (according to their principal's discretion). For elementary schools, grade six students may be invited to participate for input on particular topics, as appropriate.

2025-26 Priorities

SACs determine spending priorities for the provincial funds allocated (currently, \$5,000 plus \$1 for each student each school year) to support student achievement, according to the terms of the SAC Agreement. In the past, funds have been used for items such as iPads to assist students with English as an additional language, teacher resources to support mini lessons for writing, children's books about online safety and enhancing the school grounds with painted buddy benches and garden upgrades. In 2025-26, the SAC will continue the thread started last year, of raising awareness for students and parents with respect to online safety. The SAC is excited to announce that we have tentatively booked a speaker on this important topic for spring 2026 for both students and staff - stay tuned for more on this in the coming months! Other areas of focus will include how the SAC can champion the new Safe School Strategy and supporting students in improving their writing skills.

Grade Six Representative

SACs obtain input from their members, student testing and surveys - but we also want to hear directly from students, parents and community members.

SAC By-laws permit the participation of grade six students on the SAC, as appropriate. Do you have a grade six student in your family that would be interested in occasionally participating on the SAC?

Meetings are virtual and are typically held at 3:30pm. If this is a role that your grade six student would be interested in, please email Principal Hawkes for more information.

School Counselling

My name is Jennifer Adams and I am the school counsellor. I work individually with students experiencing many different issues including (but not limited to): anxiety, grief, anger, low mood, parental separation and divorce, body image, self-esteem, friendships, family stress and conflict with peers. I will also be working with small groups of students who share particular concerns and doing full class lessons on healthy relationships and other issues that teachers identify as a need in their classroom. I work collaboratively with all teachers and specialists in the school to support and teach pro-social behaviours to help ensure that students are successful in school. You can contact me directly to refer your child (jadams@hrce.ca). I require a new consent form every school year so once you contact me I will generate the form and send it home with your child. It can be returned to the classroom teacher who will see that I receive it.


Welcome back to Phys Ed.
